RE: Alaska Commons Surgery Center, LLC Request for Determination

Dear Mr. Marek,

Thank you for your request for a determination of whether a certificate of need is necessary to co-locate a one operating room ambulatory surgery project with an existing ambulatory surgery center. Alaska Commons Surgery Center, LLC (ACSC) seeks to co-locate a single operating room ambulatory surgery center with Alaska Eye Surgery and Laser Center, Inc., (AESLC) which is an ambulatory eye surgery and laser center located in a free-standing building located at 235 E. 8th Avenue in Anchorage, Alaska.

Since they will be temporally located, ACSC's costs are estimated using a percentage of the total costs expended by AESLC based on the ratio of 1/7th of the original tenant improvements, base equipment and other additional costs that are specific ACSC. This percentage is based on ACSC operating one day a week and the Alaska Eye and Laser Center, Inc. operating a maximum of six days per week.

The original project costs and the proposed ACSC allocation expenditure:

You confirmed that the additional equipment costs are specific to ACSC and are to be used in the pain management surgical procedures to be performed by ACSC. You state that the AESLC can provide all other basic equipment needed to conduct core operations.

You also provided additional explanation regarding how the surgery specialties you offer will differ from those offered by AESLC. The surgical specialties you will offer are for pain management while the current surgical services offered by AESLC are specific to eye surgery and laser procedures.

You anticipate operating the ACSC one day a week; while AESLC will operate a maximum of six days a week.

CMS does permit two different Medicare-participating ASCs to use the same physical space, so long as they are temporally separated. That is, the two facilities must have entirely separate operations, records, etc., and may not be open at the same time.

Based on this information and your request for determination, a CON is not required for the proposed project, as presented, because the expenditures at issue do not exceed the \$1.5 million statutory threshold under AS 18.07.031.

If you are dissatisfied with this determination, you may request reconsideration under 7 AAC07.033. A request for reconsideration must be postmarked no later than 30 days after publication of the public notice.
